Internet on the Go! Checkout Mobile Hotspots

Don't have WiFi at home? Traveling and unsure of Internet availability?

Beginning this month, the library will lend mobile hotspot devices to Warminster and Ivyland patrons. A \$5 fee may apply to others, similar in policy to our museum passes.

Devices can be used in any location where a cellular signal is detected and connect through any WiFi-enabled mobile device, laptop, printer, digital camera or gaming device. Hotspot devices tap into 4G cellular service to provide WiFi connection for up to 10 different devices within short-range.

Please bring your device. Registration is required.




Adult Book Club Corner
